The Ohio State University College of Public Health invites applications for a tenured or tenure-track faculty position in the Division of Biostatistics.

All applicants must have a PhD in Statistics or Biostatistics. Candidates for Associate Professor should have a bibliography of peer-reviewed publications, a record of funded research, and teaching experience. Candidates for the Assistant Professor position should have peer-reviewed publications, a record of collaboration on funded research, and interest in teaching.

All new faculty will be involved in teaching and methodological research, collaboration with OSU investigators, and mentoring of graduate students.

Rank and salary will be determined by the candidate's credentials. Applications will be considered as they arrive and the date of appointment is open to negotiation. Women and other under-represented groups are especially encouraged to apply.

The College is part of the country's most comprehensive health sciences center – the Colleges of Medicine, Pharmacy, Nursing, and Dentistry, as well as the James comprehensive Cancer Center and the Ross Heart Hospital, are adjacent to the College of Public Health.
