



## **Faculty position, Health Equity and Multicultural Health**

### **The Ohio State University College of Public Health**

The Ohio State University College of Public Health is searching for candidates for a faculty position with a research, teaching and service focus related to health equity and multicultural health. Duties of the position include teaching graduate and undergraduate courses related to health disparities, conducting community-based research, and providing leadership in establishing relationships within and outside the University in the area of health equity and multicultural health. Expertise in community-based participatory research is particularly desired.

The successful candidate is expected to help develop a Center for Health Equity and Multicultural Health within the college. The Center, in coordination with the College's Center for Public Health Practice, will help coordinate the academic research and service activities of faculty and students in the College of Public Health around issues of minority health, health disparities, health equity, environmental justice, and community involvement, and will serve as a liaison between the concerns of community members and the college.

Candidates should have a demonstrated track record in conducting community-based public health research and a commitment to improving the health of diverse and underserved communities. Candidates should also have a demonstrated ability to communicate with diverse populations and collaborate with community leaders. The successful candidate will be expected to collaborate with existing faculty and to develop their own program of funded research involving outreach to communities and issues of health equity for diverse communities. High quality graduate teaching and advising are also expected. This position would be offered as a tenure-track, tenured, or multi-year contract position, depending on the background and career goals of the successful applicant.

A doctoral degree in public health, medicine, or a related discipline is required. Appointment type, rank and salary will be determined by the candidate's credentials. For appointment to a tenured position, applicants must have a strong record of funded research and peer-reviewed publications.

Applications will be accepted through March 1, 2010 and will be considered as they arrive. The date of appointment is open to negotiation.
