- US citizenship or permanent residency.
- Terminal degree (PhD, DNP, DPH or MD) in a social or behavioral science, public health, nursing, or medicine
- **Demonstrated skills in research methods and biostatistics**

Application deadline November 30, 2009 for two year position starting January 1, 2010.
