BIostatistician in Environmental Health

The Florida Department of Health (FDOH) will be recruiting for a Biostatistician, located in the Bureau of Environmental Public Health Medicine (EPHM) in the Division of Environmental Health. This position will be responsible for technical/consultative services for EPHM in planning and implementing investigations pertaining to health outcomes associated with exposure to environmental contaminants. The work will involve review and analysis of different datasets in environmental health (cancer registry, birth defects registry, water samples datasets, community health survey datasets, etc.). The applicant will be assisting in the design and development of statistically valid study proposals including management of data collection, statistical and epidemiologic analysis of data, results reporting. Responsibilities will involve working closely with epidemiologists, toxicologists, GIS technology staff and other experts in the division.

We are looking for someone with 2 or more years of experience in biostatistics with a health data background. Knowledge of epidemiological study methods and knowledge of environmental health is desirable. Requires a strong background in statistical data analysis using statistical software such as SAS (SAS required), SPSS, Epi-Info, Access, Excel and Arc-view GIS. Excellent oral and written communication skills are essential. Salary: \$43,000 - \$48,000/year depending upon experience.

EPHM contains epidemiologists, toxicologists, public health veterinarians, and other professionals and includes the following programs: Lead Surveillance, Arbovirus Surveillance, Food and Waterborne Disease, Environmental Public Health Tracking, Aquatic Toxins, Birth Defects, Toxicology, and Chemical and Pesticide Surveillance.

FDOH is located in scenic Tallahassee, Florida's state capital and home of Florida State University and Florida A & M University. The Tallahassee region has an abundance of state parks and waterways, good schools, affordable housing and is 90 minutes to the Gulf's white sand beaches. Tallahassee is known for its subtropical climate and mild short winters with a population in the metropolitan area of about 350,000.
