During my master's program, I was very fortunate that Professor Eddy Lam, a biostatistician, provide me an opportunity to work in a research project related to clinical trial design. The project is co-supervised by Professor Lin Ruitao at the MD Anderson Cancer Center. We tried to "save" the type I error by sculpting the rejection region in two-stage adaptive trial design for smaller sample size under a certain power restriction. I learned that sometimes simple ideas make difference in biostatistics. Additionally, I was trained to provide reasonable interpretation of complex framework in plain language.
